Convolvulus simulans L. M. Perry, SMALL-FLOWERED MORNING GLORY. Annual, finetaprooted, rosetted and with deeply 2-lobed cotyledons, 1-several-stemmed at base, lax and sometimes looped around adjacent plant stems but not twining, decumbent to ascending, branches 10–40 cm long; shoots strigose and pilose. **Stems:** cylindric, < 1.5 mm diameter, tough, green aging purple especially at base, strigose. Leaves: helically alternate, simple, petiolate, without stipules; petiole not sharply defined from blade, channeled only partially, 4–7 mm long, pilose and sparsely strigose; blade narrowly oblanceolate to nearly linear, $15-35(-60) \times 1.5-6$ mm, flat, long-tapered to petiole at base, subentire to inconspicuously short-toothed on margins, acute to \pm rounded at tip, somewhat folded along midrib, inconspicuously pinnately veined, dull, pilose or pilose and strigose. Inflorescence: 1-flowered cyme (flowers solitary), axillary, in every leaf axil of upper plant, bracteate; peduncle ascending to spreading, at anthesis 3–20 mm long and increasing ca. 5 mm in fruit, slender becoming wiry; bractlets 2, opposite or subopposite, typically 2– 3 mm below calyx, \pm short-linear, at anthesis 2–3 mm long increasing 2–3× in fruit, \pm strigose. Flower: bisexual, radial, \pm 6 mm across; pleated and twisted in bud; sepals 5, \pm free, overlapping, unequal, 2.3–3.5 mm long and slightly longer in fruit, heteromorphic, outer 2 sepals narrowly ovate to lanceolate, ca. 1 mm wide, narrowly membranous or not on margins, 2 sepals ovate or oval, ca. 1.8 mm wide, broadly membranous on overlapped margin, narrowly so on exposed margin, the innermost sepal elliptic, 1.5–1.8 mm wide, broadly membranous on margins, \pm erect and stiff at bases, sometimes with minute point at tip, spreading in fruit, exposed surfaces purplish and pilose; corolla 5-lobed, bell-shaped, 4–6 mm long, glabrous; tube cup-shaped, white or pinkish; lobes spreading, rounded oblong, ± 2 mm long, lavender (sometimes appearing bluish); stamens 5, fused to base of floral tube, included; filaments \pm equal, 1.5–2 mm long, white, flared at base, bases with colorless glandular hairs; anthers basifixed, dithecal, to 0.6 mm long, white, longitudinally dehiscent; pollen colorless; **nectary** surrounding base of ovary, ringlike, thin, yellowish; pistil 1, 3 mm long; ovary superior, broadly ovoid, 1.5–2 mm long, translucent-white, 2chambered, each chamber with 2 ovules attached to base; style to 1.3 mm long, white; stigmas 2, club-shaped, 1 mm long, white. Fruit: capsule, loculicidal, 4-seeded, depressed-obovoid, $3.2-4 \times 3.7-6$ mm, with persistent style, slightly lobed opposite each seed. **Seed:** \pm obovoid, $2.2-2.5 \times 2-2.2$ mm, with 2 flat sides at right angles where seed faces touch, brown; seed coat conspicuously papillate, the papillae typically \pm colorless at tip. Early April–early May.

Native. An inconspicuous, narrow-leaved annual growing in grassland on heavy, cracking clay at Wildwood Regional Park in SH, but expected elsewhere. *Convolvulus simulans* has narrow leaves and comparatively small flowers so does not at first resemble its larger cousins with showy white flowers.

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
